

A Crisis Residential Program (CRP) for Transition Age Youth (TAY)



- SB 82 funds for building purchase and remodeling
- Licensed by the Community Care Licensing Division or the Department of Social Services
- Certified by the Department of Health Care Services
- MediCal funded



Facts about the CRP

- Transition Age Youth (TAY) ages 18-29
- No more than 15 residents at one time
- Average stay under 30 days
- Diversion or step-down from emergency room or acute care services
- Supports transition to housing, employment, education, and ongoing care
- Home-like environment (in contrast to institutional settings)






Counseling Center

- MediCal and Mental Health Services Act funded






Facts about the Counseling Center


- Transition Age Youth (TAY) ages 18-25

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



